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WORKSHOPS

Colour a Map of Sharjah

Ages 4–5 (accompanied by an adult)

Date: Monday, 31 July 2023

Timings: 11:00 am–12:30 pm

Location: The Flying Saucer, Sharjah

Languages: English and Arabic



Introduce your children to different locations and buildings in Sharjah, and develop their social and emotional skills as they colour a map of Sharjah. The large-format map will be cut into four sections so that budding artists can have more control over their colouring of the shapes and objects. After all the sections are coloured, they will be put together in one map.
